a. What astounded me the most is the culture of Germany and how warm the German people are unlike how they are portrayed as being cold and prejudicial against Turkish people in the media. And as a positive quality, most of the Germans are fluent and capable of communicating in English, that's why nobody can be without help in a literal way. Most of the Germans are very open minded and radical in many issues for example if a homosexual couple is seen while holding hands in the street, it is not frowned upon and criticized but on the contrary it is seen as normal and natural; however, if this case was to happen in a country like Turkey, they would be beaten to death or put behind bars, surely. It is a very democratic country filled with unusually rule abiding citizens. b. The education system in Germany is much more different, superior but sometimes lacking when compared to Turkey. German students are more active, self-assertive and have a firm grasp on speaking English than Turkish students.
