Aim of the Course: The aim of this course is to help the students gain the knowledge, skills and competence required to identify and discuss contemporary life and society in Britain in relation to locale and people, institutions, customs and manners, gender, social class and daily routines. Through this course, the students are expected to discuss life, society and the individual in contemporary Britain.

Course Content: In this course, British institutions such as education, law, administration, family, religion as well as social class, gender, daily life, customs and manners in the multicultural Britain are introduced and discussed.

Course Requirements and Method: It is essential for students to read/watch the assigned material before class meetings because the course will be conducted in the form of class discussions and references to the texts will be made necessary. The course will also rely on a wide range of visual material that the students will be responsible for. Needless to say each student should have his/her own text, which will be brought to class.
