I. Aim of the Course

The course aims to make the students familiar with literary types and terms. Such a study is essential for a better understanding of literary texts. The students will analyse and evaluate a selection of texts of poetry, prose and drama of various types.

II. Course Outline

Week I : Introduction to Literary terms, What is Literature?

Week II : Literary Types: **Poetry and types of poetry**: Lyric, ode, ballad, sonnet, epic, mock-epic,

romance, pastoral, eclogue, allegory, satire, bestiary, fable...

Week III : Figurative language and figures of speech: Imagery, symbol, metaphor, simile, conceit,

personification, paradox, oxymoron, irony, hyperbole, understatement, pun, euphemism,

antithesis-opposition..

Week IV : Versification and stanza forms: Meter, Rhyme, Couplet, Alliteration, Assonance, Blank

Verse, Free Verse...

Week V : **Prose:** Fiction: fable, saga, legend, myth, short story, novella, novel, types of novel...

Week VI : Non-fiction :journal, memoir, biography, autobiography, essay, travel literature

Week VII : Mid-Term I

Week VIII : Elements of Narrative: Plot (rising action, climax, falling action, resolution), character

(protagonist, antagonist, flat character, round character), action, sub-plot, prologue,

There will be two Mid-Terms (50%) and a Final (50%) examination. Marks below 50 (out of 100) in the Final Exam will be regarded as failure. In the grading of the examination papers, up to 25% of the total mark will be taken off for grammatical and writing mistakes.
