I. Aim of the Course

The aim of the course is to help the students develop effective study skills such as reading, skimming, note taking, revising, studying for exams and tips for success in exams, and to teach the students the necessary steps of research and writing a paper, which include selecting a topic, using the library, compiling a working bibliography, taking notes, avoiding plagiarism, preparing an outline and well-organised, adequately supported research paper.

IV. Method of Instruction

The course will be conducted in the form of lectures, group work and individual work. Most of the material will be covered through practical work in class as well as the library.

V. Requirements

The students are expected to come to class having read the assigned topics before coming to class. Attendance is obligatory. More than 11 (eleven) hours of absence will result in F1.

There will be a visit to the library and to the computer lab for orientation. The students will carry out extensive research at Beytepe and other libraries.

Each student will determine the topic for her/his research paper and will be responsible in conducting his/her own research project. The research paper will be MLA formatted and maximum 5 pages double-spaced. Writing the final draft of the project and an in-class exam will be evaluated as the final exam and marks below 50 in the final exam will be regarded as failure.

Plagiarism in written tasks and exams will result in failure.

VI. Assessment

The students will be receiving marks for all types of written and oral work they do such as research tasks and inclass workshops. There will be two Mid-Terms and a Final examination. In the grading of the examination papers, up to 25% of the total mark will be taken off for grammatical and writing mistakes. Class participation will be seriously taken into consideration while giving the final grades.
