Week XIV: Roman Comedy-Plautus- The Pot of Gold

III. **Text Books**: There is no set book for the course. The students are responsible for obtaining the Xerox copies of the assigned materials.

- IV. **Method of Instruction:** The students are expected to read the assigned materials beforehand since the Course will mainly be based on discussions and lecturing done in the class. The first two weeks of the Course will be introductory lessons. Then, it will turn to student-oriented one in which they will be responsible to read the given material. There will be two midterm examinations to be graded together with the class participation and the final exam.
- V. **Requirements:** Attendance is compulsory. More than 11 hrs of absence will result in F1. Since the Course will be student-centered, the students are expected to come to class having read the assigned material.

VI. **Assessment**: There will be two mid-term examinations and a final. The class participation of the students together with the midterm examinations will constitute 70% of the total assessment:

Midterms 40% Class Participation 20% and study questions. Final 40%

In the grading of all written and oral work 25% of the total mark will be taken off for the use of English and grammatical mistakes. It should be noted that the students who will not get 50 points in the final examination will fail the course, no matter how high the midterm marks are.
