III. Textbooks

IV. Method of Instruction

It will be conducted through lecturing and discussion of the the assigned material. All lectures will be supported with audio visual material, which the students will be responsible for. Class participation and is essential. Each student will present a brief oral report.

V. Requirements

VI. Assessment
