## SYLLABUS

**Title of the Course:** IED 151 (03) Introduction to Britain I **Year and Term:** 2015- 2016 Fall **Class: Wednesday** 13:00- 15:45 **Classroom:** B2/204

**Aim:** The aim of the course is to make a survey of Britain and British literature in its historical context. In accordance with this, the historical evolution of the British society and literature from the early ages to the 17<sup>th</sup> century will be explored through the study of major social, political and historical developments and their reflections in literature of the relevant periods.
