## **Syllabus**

**Aim**:The objective in the intensive study of seventeen representative texts will be to develop student awareness of the short story as a literary genre. At the beginning of the course, relevant literary terms will be explained and exemplified in detail. Then, the origins of the short story will be examined and its development into a modern genre will be illustrated through the works of late nineteenth- century American, French and Russian pioneers. The core of the course will constitute twentieth-century English short story writers and their works. In addition, American and Turkish short story writers will be included for comparative purposes. The thematic, technical and stylistic contribution of each writer will be thoroughly analysed. Students will be expected to develop a critical appreciation of the short story as a modern genre.

**Film:** F. Scott Fitzgerald's "Bernice Bobs Her Hair" will be shown and discussed in class.

**Requirements**: Attendance is obligatory; more than 11 hours of absence will result in F1. Students are expected to come to class on time, with the relevant text and having read the assigned material.

**Method of Instruction**. The course will be conducted through lecturing, , occasional group work, and class discussions.

## **Assessment:**

Mid-Term Exams: 20% each; 40 %

10 min. Oral Presentation: 10 % (Plagiarism will result in F3)

Final Exam: 50%

In the grading of all written and oral work 25% will be taken off for English mistakes. Students must receive at least 50 points over 100 from the Final Exam.
